
# Big Island Amateur Radio Club BIARC BULLETIN August 2005

# General Membership Meeting - Saturday, July 9th, 2005

Call to order by the President at 2:00P

In attendance were 28 members and 13 guests (sign-in sheet is attached to, and made a part of these minutes)

President Barbara [NH7FY] asked everyone to introduce themselves and indicate anything noteworthy (radio related or otherwise)

Of interest- there are quite a few guests in attendance due to today's entertainment

An announcement was made by Ken [N6KB] about the recently concluded field day activities. The general consensus was that it was very well executed, thanks to a lot of diligent operating and the support of many club members.

The regular membership meeting was held after our program, which is the 2nd annual Hawaiian Music festival. While amateur radio is a means of communicating likewise is hula and other forms of Hawaiian music. Hence the appropriateness of our program today.

Details of the program can be found in the President's column.

After the entertainment we were treated to some very special refreshments furnished by Gloria [Associate], Lori [AH6OS] and Barbara [NH7FY]. Leave it to our refreshment people to offer some very delicious edibles, and it even tied in to today's program..

Secretary's report- as published in the June 2005 newsletter - Approved.

Treasurer's report as furnished by Ron [AH6HN] indicates a balance of \$1446.91 (subject to audit)

While a significant amount was debited for repeaters, a contribution of \$50 was received for the same purpose - Approved.

Membership is counted as 114

Committee Reports

Repeaters- Mauna Loa had equipment changed; Pepeekeo crystals are ready to be installed; a test of Mauna Kea had very marginal results

Field Day- Ken reported during the announcement portion of the agenda but added that there were ten operators throughout the day and evening.

Health and Welfare- Both Ann Miller [Associate] and Mike [NH7JT] are doing well at this time.

Old Business

Volcano Rim Run- It was reported that all is in order per the event's chairman, Sean [NH7SA]

New Business-

The President read a letter of resignation from BIARC Board member Bill [NH7RQ] citing health reasons. The resignation was accepted and Bill was thanked for his participation.

The Board of Directors felt that it would be in the best interests of BIARC to have a unique web site, and therefore presented the following to the membership for its consideration: Rick [AH7H] gave a report indicating what the costs would be on an annual basis, as well as the availability of BIARC name related web sites. It was stated that the start-up cost would be \$50, with a recurring annual charge of also \$50. The expertise to create the web site would be handled by Rick, at no cost to BIARC (aside from the aforementioned costs). However, it was suggested that he also advise others as to how to up-date the site. This will allow others to maintain it so that Rick wouldn't be solely responsible for its content. After discussion a motion was made {Ken [N6KB] and seconded {Lori [AH6OS] to proceed with the establishment of a web site by Rick. The motion was carried. Then a general discussion was held as to the identification of our web site. With Rick again offering his advice, it was decided by the majority of the members in attendance to seek the use of biarc.net as our identifier. There is a very good likelihood that this name is available. Other names of interest were kh6ej.org and biarc-kh6ej.org.

The Hawaiian Paradise Park (HPP) location has been reserved for Field Day 2006. If a better location is selected, we are not obligated to utilize HPP and can relinquish it. Another location under consideration is Wailoa SP. Input from the membership is solicited.

Secretary Mike [NH7]T] will seek out sources of possible funds, via grants, allocations, etc. from the various County, State and Federal elected officials and organizations. Since the majority of BIARC members are residents from throughout the County, he will be in contact with all Senators and Representatives that represent any portion of Hawai'i County, as well as the entire Hawai'i County Council. A letter will be formulated and presented to the Board for approval.

The Bylaws review committee, consisting of Ron [AH6HN], Lloyd [KH6LC], Harry [KH6FKG] and Nancy [NH7RT] will conduct an initial meeting as scheduling allows.

The newsletter editor, Sean [NH7SA] has indicated a change to the physical format to allow for easier production of the electronic version.

A discussion was held relative to having the services of Notary Joyce Carlson available at future meetings. The President will contact her seeking comments on this arrangement.
