

Field Day Report 2006

The summery of our report to the ARRL is as follows:

Total CW QSOs are 9

Total Phone QSOs are 115

Total points base on the above with 2x for CW and 1x for phone equals


133, and 2x for power under 150 watts we have a claimed score of 266.

As you can see, we did very well considering the conditions of ionosphere which were rather poor. We made 39 QSOs on 40 meters. On 20 meters we made 6 CW and 35 phone QSOs.. On 15 meters we made # CW and

41 phone OSOs. As usual, there were a few duplicated, but only a few. We could hear signals on 80 meters, but they did not hear us.

The local weather was good with almost no rain. It was rather cool and not too hot. It was a very pleasant for Field Day. The antenna crew did a great job raising and lowering the two three band trap yagi beams.

The Kona Club members, KH7DX, Stu, and AH6RR,, Roland, brought a 3-element wire array antenna for 40 and 80 meters, and put it up during the morning. It worked well. They strung it on a centerline at 35 feet high with drooping ends over the football field. Maximum cool 3 to 4

I brought a home brew "hack saw" high speed paddle key on a wood base with wood paddle. Bob Schneider, AH6J borough a homemade metal high-speed paddle, which he had made several years ago which was very good. No one has sent in any photographs of them yet.. They work two stations on CW. I work a few CW stations during the day and night. It only takes time to get on and make as contacts. The more you do it, the faster you become. It can be great fun too. Many thanks to all whom participated this year. We will be giving out a commemorative Field Day certificate (ready for framing) at our next club meeting to operators and crew. We had a great time, and next year I hope we can do it again. The sunspot cycle was at it's lowest in the eleven years. 




