# **ARRL Section Manager's Report**

[This report has been edited owing to space limitations. Club information for clubs not on the big island and some duplicate information has been removed. The full report is available to ARRL members via www.arrl.org]

We are coming to the official end of hurricane season however storms or other disasters are always possible. There was recently a large earthquake in Tonga and a late season hurricane just passed over Cuba. It was two years ago that we had the large earthquake on the Big Island.

It is with great sadness that we report the passing of Noburo "Larry" Iwami, KH6ATQ, on October 17. According to the Hawaii Tribune-Herald he was 87. He was a WW2 veteran and served in Japan in the 441st Counter Intelligence Corps. He was a long time member of the Big Island Amateur Radio Club (BIARC). He retired as a power plant superintendent and production superintendent

for the former Hilo Coast Processing company. It was largely through his efforts that BIARC has the use of the Pepeekeo repeater site. Services were November first at Church of the Holy Cross in Hilo, HI.

Hams on the Kona side of the Big Island supported the Ironman race in October by supplying communications along the bike route where cell phone and other coverage is weak. They also helped supply TV coverage. See the SM webpage for a picture.

Your SM attended the Koolau ARC meeting October 11. Thanks for the hospitality. The wife really enjoyed the Ho'omaluhia Botanical Gardens. The KARC program was "Martin" Barr, KH6MB, presenting an introduction to antenna modeling. It is in two parts and next month will be the conclusion. The original programming was done in FORTRAN language but has been extensively modified for easier usage over the years. FORTRAN was in use in the mid 1960's at the University of Hawaii and required the programming be done with punch cards.

On October 15 there was a day long Table Top disaster exercise in Hilo. Harvey Motomura, AH6JA, was the invited delegate from the Amateur Radio Community. Harvey is the East Hawaii ARRL DEC. Your SM (me) and the North Hawaii DEC Eric Grabowski, KH6CQ, also attended as non-participating observers. There was supposed to be a Tabletop exercise on Oahu on October 23 however we have no information on that.

There was a Simulated Emergency Test (SET) exercise Saturday Oct 18 from 9 to noon. It was mostly on two meters with some HF operation. REACT also held an exercise on the same day called Project SOS. REACT is made up of both hams and unlicensed members. In a recent exercise they found that FRS radios (Family Radio Service) have a range of two miles or more. With a mixed membership non hams can really be used to fill in the gaps in a widespread disaster. The goal is to get the message through. Thanks to Rob Roberts, KH7MW, for part of this information.

The Kona ARS held its regular meeting on Sunday Oct 19. It met at the OTEC beach park at the NELHA. The theme was Oktoberfest so German food was the order of the day.

The November 8 BIARC meeting was at the Hilo Elks Club since the Keaau Center was unavailable. Elections were held. On

December 13 there will be a Christmas Pot Luck and meeting at 2PM at the Puna Congregational Christian Church because the Keaau Community Center was again unavailable. Thanks to both the Hilo Elks and PCCC for making their facilities available at no cost. The weekly Friday lunch meeting of Big Island Hams will no longer be at the Hilo Hawaiian Hotel Queen's Court restaurant. New owners have taken over and implemented several changes. The search is on for another site for the weekly BIARC lunches. Barbara Darling, NH7FY, will be sending weekly e-mails as to where the Friday lunch will be on a particular week.

World Radio is to cease print publication. In a joint statement, World Radio Publisher Armond Noble, N6WR, and CQ Publisher Dick Ross, K2MGA, announced that World Radio magazine will no longer be published as a print magazine. According to the announcement, CQ Communications Inc has acquired World Radio & plans to continue it as an online publication on CQ's Web site. World Radio subscribers will have their subscriptions transferred to CQ magazine. Readers will be notified of details as plans are finalized. World Radio is in Newspaper format.



# Big Island Amateur Radio Club General Membership Meeting November 8, 2008

Barbara Darling, NH7FY opened the meeting at 2PM. Since the Keaau Community Hall was rented out for the day the meeting was held at the Elks Club on Kinoole St, Hilo. Sign in sheet was passed around and is attached to the minutes.

Introductions were made. Barbara announced that Noboru "Larry" Iwami KH6ATQ had died on October 17. A moment of silence was held for him. Bob AH6J announced that on Tuesday, November 11<sup>th</sup> there will be testing at 10:30AM at the Puna Congregational Church. It was also reported that Field Day KH6EJ came in 1st in the Pacific area and 178<sup>th</sup> place in the country out of 2,406.

Secretary's minutes from September meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter;

Bob AH6J reported that he and Harvey AH6JA attended an Emergency Responder meeting held at Imiloa Astronomy Center recently.

Barbara NH7FY reported that she sent thank you letters to Cody at the Wailoa Center and to the Hamakua Framing and Structure for the use of the boom truck on Field Day.

Paul WH7BR, Barbara NH7FY and Fred KH6FI have agreed to cook the turkeys. Barbara has asked Joyce WH6BIR to swear in the new officers. Members should let Paul WH7BR know what

Bob AH6J made a motion, seconded by Robert NH6AH that we leave our fees the same for next year. All approved. A membership form will be included in our December newsletter.

They refused to combine partially filled cards and will not let cards with past due dates be used. If the full card does not have a date it must be used by December 31st. Noboru "Larry" lwami KH6ATQ 1921-2008

Larry Iwami was born June 6, 1921 in Hilo, in the old hospital at Rainbow Falls. After high school graduation and a year working in a radio shop, Larry took the Matsonia to California where he entered National School, a vocational school for training in electricity. While in California he was one of thousands of Japanese-Americans interned in relocation camps. He spent nearly two years at the Gila River Relocation Center near Phoenix, Arizona. He was drafted into the army and because of his knowledge of Japanese was sent for Counter Intelligence training and spent a year in Japan after the war ended as a Special Agent.

After discharge he took advantage of the GI bill and entered Milwaukee School of Engineering in the fall of 1947. After receiving his degree in electrical engineering he returned to Hilo and went to work for the Hilo Sugar Co. He worked for C Brewer and remained with them until his retirement.

Larry's call sign was KH6ATQ. While spending three years in Ecuador he kept in touch with Hawaiian families by ham radio. He was active in the Big Island Amateur Radio Club for many years. It was largely through Larry's efforts that BIARC has access to the Pepeekeo repeater site.

Larry was very active in the Church of the Holy Cross, where he met his wife Barbara. He spent many hours on building maintenance there. He also volunteered for 10 years as a tax aide for AARP.

Larry is survived by his wife Barbara, daughter Iris, son Eric, brother Masaru, three grandchildren, one great-grandchild, nephews and nieces. He died on October 17, 2008 after battling cancer for the last two years.

#### **BIARC Radio Contest News**

The contest news is compiled from reports by members, and from information appearing on the 3830 contest reflector.

Results have been announced for **ARRL Field Day**, and the BIARC station **KH6EJ** took first place overall in the Pacific Section. Congratulations to all who participated in this fun event.

It has been a busy month for the local radio sport enthusiasts. We opened up with the **CQ Worldwide SSB**. **Fred NH6P(KH7Y)** had a single-band 15 meter operation and made 1984 Qs in 30 zones and 59 countries for a score of 509703. **Bill KH7B** showed off his 40m stacked beams in a single band 40m effort netting 2410 Qs, 37 sections, and 106 countries for a 1020591 score that put him at the top of the list of reported scores in his category on the 3830 reflector at the time I write. **Jeff N6GQ** operated **KH6LC** on all bands for a total of 3850 Qs, 125 zones, and 259 countries for a score of 4334976.

And then there was the **ARRL Sweepstakes CW**. **Fred KH7Y** made 606 Qs and a clean sweep in 12 hours for 96960 points. **Goran SM0DRD** had the stamina to operate **KH6LC** 24 hours for 1275 points and a clean sweep and 204000 points.

The radio at **KH6LC** had barely cooled off from Sweepstakes when **Goran SM0DRD** was back at it in the **Japan International DX** Contest with 300 Qs in a single band 15m operation for 13500 points, putting him at the top of the list in his category on the 3830 reflector at the time of writing.

The very next weekend was the **ARRL Sweepstakes SSB**. **Bill KH7B** placed high with 2196 Qs and a clean sweep of sections for 351360 points in a 24 hour operation. **Fred KH7Y** worked 14 hours to get 925 Qs and a clean sweep for 148000 points, and **Goran SM0DRD** operated **KH6LC** 13 hours for 861 Qs and another clean sweep for 137760 points.

The **CQ Worldwide CW** is still a few hours from completion as this is being written. Conditions don't seem quite as good as last year, owing to the bad state of the 10 meter band and marginal performance of 15 meters. Rumor has it that the crew at **KH6LC** will have local competition in the multi-2 category this year. Full results next month!

Irene NH7PE received some wallpaper from the ARRL. She won

First Place, Single Operator, Phone Only, Low Power, Hawaii Section in the **2007 ARRL 10 Meter** Contest. Irene won this with SEVEN contacts! This year the contest will be held for 48 hours on December 13 & 14. How about some competition? Also, let us all practice on our straight keys for the friendly practice of Straight Key Night, on New Year's Eve. (thanks Irene NH7PE)
